

#### Days From Date of Injury to Employer Notification




#### Days from Injury to Employer Notification

- LA Basin
  - Average 21
  - Median 1
- Rest of CA
  - Average 9
  - Median 1

- LA's average days is more than twice as long as rest of CA
- The median (50<sup>th</sup>) is the same: outliers drive the difference

## Days From Employer Notification to 1<sup>st</sup> Medical Treatment




Days from Employer Notification to 1<sup>st</sup> Medical Treatment

- LA Basin
  - Average 27
  - Median Same Day or Prior
- Rest of CA
  - Average 21
  - Median Same Day or Prior

- LA's Average Days is 30% higher than the rest of the State
- The median (50<sup>th</sup>) is the same: outliers drive the difference

## Claim Status-Indemnity Claims




#### Closure Percent

- LA Basin 77%
- Rest of CA 82%

LA claims remain open longer.

## Claim Status-Indemnity Claims



- Attorney Involvement
  - LA Basin 58%
  - Rest of CA 41%

LA indemnity claims have more attorney involvement.


## Average Cost Per Indemnity Claim By Cost Component LA Basin and Rest of State AY 2006-2015


# Average Cost Per Indemnity Claim with Attorney Involvement LA Basin vs Rest of State AY 2006-2015


#### Medical Cost Drivers for Indemnity Claims

- Employee / Job Characteristics
  - Industry, Age, Gender, Job Tenure
- Claim Status and Type
  - Attorney Involvement
  - Permanent Disability
- Injury Characteristics
  - Nature of Injury
  - Cause of Injury
  - Body Part

- Medical Diagnosis
  - Mental Health Diagnosis
  - Other Diagnoses and Other Comorbidities
- Treatment Differences
  - Opioid Use
  - Psychotropic Drug Use
  - Inpatient Stays

## LA Medical Cost Drivers Responsible for Higher Costs

## Cost Drivers Percent Contribution to Higher Costs in LA Basin





- Opioid use is less than the rest of the State
- Inpatient service use is lower in LA but not Orange/Inland Empire Counties

#### LA County Comparisons: San Diego and Bay Area






The results are similar when cost drivers are compared to SD and Bay Area





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
#### 2015 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter IMR Decision Results Top Volume Providers

#### % of IMR Decisions for Top Volume Providers January – June 2015



- Overall in California, The top 1% of providers named on IMR determinations drive 40% of the IMR decisions and the top 10% drive 81%.
- The LA Basin follows the State-wide pattern
- The top 10 LA Basin individual physicians drive 18% of the decisions in LA
